

PARISH ENVELOPES: Contributing to parish life means being part of the parish family, attending Church, volunteering in the various ministries and joining parish groups and societies. However, as our parish grows and develops so does the expenditure. We have to ensure that our income covers our expenditure if we wish to have a viable parish. Prior to 2014, the deficit of the parish was over $\pounds 250$ k over five years. Historically, the parish relied on legacies to ensure it did not go into debt. We understand that there are many reasons why some people do not want envelopes. However, envelopes are still the best way to contribute to parish life. There was a tradition in the parish to send envelopes to people moving into the parish and to the parents of children baptised here. This meant that over 400 boxes of envelopes were sent out at a cost of nearly $\pounds 1000$ per year but more than $\frac{1}{4}$ were never used. To save money, if envelopes have not been used for a year, we will not reissue.

Q - I prefer to put money on the plate, why should I use envelopes?

A. – Envelopes are the best way for the parish to develop a regular, accountable and transparent income that strengthens its financial position. If you pay income tax and sign a simple form, we can claim an extra 25p in every pound you donate via envelopes. This does not incur any additional cost for you. We cannot claim full gift aid on loose plate collections. Last year 145 people signed up for gift aid. Over 200 people with envelopes did not sign up for gift aid. Not all of these people are non tax payers. We claimed an extra £10, 000 last year back from the Government at no extra cost to those parishioners.

 $\mathbf{Q}.$ - I am a private person and I don't want people in the parish to know what I give.

A. - Envelopes are registered with a number and access to parishioners' details are protected by passwords. Only office staff have access to these details for administrative purposes.

 $\mathbf{Q}.-\mathbf{I}$ can't be bothered with envelopes. What if \mathbf{I} forget to bring my envelopes?

A. – Please consider an allocated box of envelopes anyway. You don't have to fill every envelope, every week You can sign the gift aid forms and set up a weekly/monthly direct debit and the parish will benefit more. You could also consider a yearly donation paid into your envelope account.

Q. - What do we need to do to make our parish more viable?

A. – Please continue to attend Mass regularly, volunteer your time and talents in one of the many ministries or groups that are being developed and ensure that the weekly collection exceeds \pounds 1600 and the monthly collection exceeds \pounds 1350. If you don't have a box of envelopes, please consider taking one. If you are a tax payer, please take two minutes to fill out a gift aid form at the back of the Church.
