VISITING CLERGY PROTOCOLS

The Diocese has protocols for Visiting Clergy in the light of the new Standards and Guidance issued by NBSCCCI. (*National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland*)

Visiting Clergy

- A visiting cleric from outside the Diocese of Down and Connor who wishes to minister here on an *ad hoc* one off basis with advanced prior knowledge, as in the majority of cases (e.g. wedding, baptism, giving a retreat etc.), will be obliged to present his *celebret* (priest I.D.) on the occasion of the event and sign the existing visitor Register retained in the Sacristy.
- The host parish is requested to inform the Diocese of the cleric's known planned visit *prior to his arrival* and provide:
 - Name of visiting cleric
 - o Diocese / Religious order etc of cleric
 - Occasion for the visit
 - Date of occasion/event
 - Residence (if remaining in the Diocese for several days and if requested by the Diocese)
- Unannounced, unplanned visits (e.g. arriving just before a funeral, etc.):

The cleric is requested to exhibit his *celebret* and sign the visitor Register in the Sacristy.

The Visitor Register will become part of the annual parish self-audit.

<u>Celebrets</u> (or equivalent Testimonial Letter or endorsement from Diocese of incardination)

A clear and polite notice is in the sacristy requesting that all visiting clerics from outside the Diocese must present a *celebret* in order to preside or concelebrate at Mass, or administer any of the sacraments. In the interest and welfare of all concerned, the Diocese has adopted a clear position in relation to visiting clergy and a simple and unequivocal way forward, as applies with the current civil marriage schedule, **"No Schedule, No Wedding" is "No Celebret, No Celebration".**
