There will be a second collection after Communion next week for our Parish Youth Ministry. The money collected will be used towards the Parish GIFT (Growing in Faith Together) programme, the John Paul II Award Scheme for young people, and any other activity for children and young people in our parish.

<u>Getting married in the Church</u> is a special celebration that requires as much or even more preparation and reflection as the other aspects of the day. Please remember that it is the couple's responsibility to ensure that both Church and civil requirements are fulfilled prior to getting married.

Wedding Mass or Wedding Service? To celebrate a valid Marriage does not require the celebration of Mass. If the majority of guests are non-Catholic and cannot receive Holy Communion, or if the couple and the majority of guests are not practicing Catholics, then a Wedding Service is considered more appropriate. If couples have not been practicing their faith for some time and wish to have a Wedding Mass, the six month notice of marriage is a great opportunity for them to return to Sunday Mass.

Couples from outside the parish and visiting priests. Couples living outside the parish are very welcome to get married here. Couples who have a friend or family member who is a priest can invite him to officiate at the wedding. He must confirm *in writing* that he is willing to conduct the wedding and that he is a registered officiant in Northern Ireland <u>before the booking is finalised</u>. In the past, visiting priests have agreed to marry couples without completing the paperwork / preparation required within the Diocese of Down and Connor. Couples and priests visiting the parish must ensure that all paperwork and preparation is completed to the requirements of our Diocese, even when the couple and / or priest reside in another diocese.

Costs. We appreciate that weddings can be very expensive and the previous requirement for a donation for use of the Church was removed four years ago. However, this has resulted in many couples living outside the parish using the Church and not making any donation. In consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council, we have decided that couples living in the parish of Aghagallon and Ballinderry, who are active in parish life (i.e. attending Sunday Mass every week) will continue to have free use of the church. For all couples living outside the parish and for those parishioners not active in parish life or contributing via a box of envelopes, a non-refundable donation of at least \pounds 150, payable at the time of booking, is now required to cover the costs of paperwork, heat, light, sacristan time, cleaning etc. Active parishioners can make a donation if they so wish. These donations will be registered as parish income in our annual report and used to offset any deficit.
