

Diocesan Guidelines: Due to the Coronavirus crisis, the Diocese have issued guidelines, which are to be followed by all parishes. The public celebration of Mass is currently suspended in all Churches within the Diocese and all the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of obligation. **Daily and Sunday Masses** will be celebrated at the normal times but

without a congregation in the Church. Services will be streamed on the parish radio and parish webcam. This can be accessed from our website www.aghagallonandballinderryparish.ie or www.mcnmedia.tv. Parishioners will not be able to attend daily or Sunday Masses in the

Church.

Anniversaries of our beloved dead will continue to be remembered and prayed for publicly. Family and friends can watch services on the webcam as the requested Masses will be offered.

Baptisms will continue as normal, but only parents, siblings, godparents and grandparents may attend.

Funerals will continue. Bereaved families are requested to restrict attendees at the funeral to close family and loved ones only. We encourage those who wish to offer sympathy at the time of bereavement to exercise safe and appropriate ways to do so in these difficult circumstances.

Weddings which have been booked will continue and we ask couples to limit guests who attend the Church to 100 people.

Adoration will continue on a Wednesday from 10.30am-10pm. We ask parishioners to adhere to the social distancing guidelines and keep a space of at least three rows from any other person in the Church.

St Patrick's Church will remain open for private personal prayer. **The Parish Office** will remain open, you can contact the office on 0289265214 or parishofaandb@yahoo.co.uk. Tuesday – Thursday 10am-4pm or Friday 10am-12noon.
