

Gradual Easing of Covid-19 policies and procedures from Saturday 19th March 2022 in St. Patrick's Church: The Minister for Health has announced significant easing of restrictions and regulations relating to Covid-19. However, the Diocese recommends a continuation of protective measures to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all members of parish communities, especially those who are anxious or vulnerable. The doors/windows remain open to ensure the Church is well ventilated. We regret that the sacristy remains closed. Parishioners should continue to wear a mask/face covering while in the Church and sanitise their hands as they enter and leave or after using the shrines.

Daily Masses, Weddings & Funerals: Will continue with all previous restrictions in place. Every third pew will be available for seating, 2m markers will remain in place for those who wish to maintain social distancing, Communion will be received at the pews and the one-way system will continue. Holy Communion will be distributed at the pews and on the hand only. The Maximum capacity of the Church with these measures in place is 140 people.

Sunday and Feast Day Masses: The above restrictions will remain in place for those sitting on the left-hand section of the Church. If Eucharistic Ministers are available to assist with the distribution of Holy Communion, the right-hand section of pews and the balcony will have free seating and every other pew will be available. Parishioners will once again process up for Holy Communion, entering the middle aisle to their left, row by row from the front of the Church and returning to their seat via the right-hand side aisle. The Eucharistic Ministers will distribute Holy Communion from behind a Perspex screen. Parishioners are asked to put their cupped hands under the screen to receive the Host. At the end of Mass. those sitting on the left-hand side of the Church are asked to leave row by row, from the front, turning left and via the side entrance. Those on the right can exist their pew from the left-hand side via the main entrance. Those sitting in the balcony can exit via the main entrance.
