

Obligation to attend Sunday/Holyday Masses: Mass on Sunday and Holydays is once again deemed to be an obligation. Gradual Easing of Covid-19 policies and procedures:

Baptisms take place the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12 noon and on Thursday evenings at 6pm. At least one month's notice is required, during which parents meet with a member of our Baptismal Team and the family attends the 11am Sunday Mass weekly, prior to the Baptism. If families are unable to complete the preparation or attend Mass, the Baptism will be rebooked to a time when they can. A total of 20 people are permitted to attend.

Weddings: Wedding guests must continue to follow all guidance and adhere to policies and procedures put in place to ensure the safety of all. Couples must contact Fr Declan six months before the date of their wedding to arrange to complete the necessary paperwork. Couples are also required to attend a pre-marriage course. A Wedding Mass is only offered to those who attend Mass in the parish *weekly* during the six-month notice of marriage period.

Baptising babies and young children: There needs to be 'a realistic hope that the child will be brought up in the catholic religion. If such hope is truly lacking, the baptism...is to be deferred.' (Can:868) Even with the best of intentions, in the middle of all the busyness a new baby brings, caring for their spiritual needs can be challenging. As part of helping parents to prepare for a baptism, our parish Baptismal Team will meet with them and present a gift box filled with everything needed for the baptism. Unless there are extenuating circumstances, such as the child being unwell, below summarises what is required in order to celebrate a Baptism in our parish.

- 1. The person booking (i.e., consenting to) the baptism should have parental responsibility or guardianship of the child and be resident in the parish or obtain a letter of permission from their home parish.
- 2. A Baptism request form must be fully completed and sent to the parish with a copy of the child's LONG birth certificate.
- 3. Parents must meet with a member of our Baptismal Team for a short, informal meeting.
- 4. If the parents are not already attending Mass weekly, they must begin attending every week for at least one month prior to the Baptism. If this is difficult, attending weekday Masses is an option.
- 5. Identify at least one Godparent who is a <u>practicing</u> catholic. They must be over 16 years old and be Confirmed, attend Mass weekly (or begin attending weekly during the month prior to the baptism) and be living a life of faith trying their best to be an example of faith. The second Godparent can be a non-practicing catholic or a non-Catholic 'witness'. NB: We can only register two Godparents in the parish register, even if parents wish to have more.

If parents cannot commit to the above, we will rebook to the Baptism to a time when they can.

If parents wish to have their child baptised in another parish, please contact the parish office to *request* a letter of freedom. This is required to enable the baptism to take place outside the parish.
